THE CHURCH YEAR

The church's year is made of different seasons, special days, holy days and saints' days. Seasons and special days are marked by the use of different colours for altar hangings and the Priest's vestments. The four standard colours are white, purple, green and red and are known as liturgical colours.

ADVENT is the four weeks of waiting before Christmas. Colour - purple.

CHRISTMAS celebrates the birth of Jesus, God's gift to the world. Colour - white.

EPIPHANY is the time when the church thinks about the wise men bringing gifts and how Jesus came for everyone. Colour - white/green

LENT is the six and a half weeks before Easter, beginning with Ash Wednesday.

Colour - purple.

EASTER is the joyful celebration of the day that Jesus rose from the dead.

Colour - white.

PENTECOST celebrates the day on which the Holy Spirit came into the lives of Jesus' followers in a powerful way. Colour - **red**
