This month the children will be learning about how to stay safe on Bonfire Night and learning all about the Firework Code. They will also be learning all about Guy Fawkes.



MATHS IS EVERYWHERE!!

In school this year we are reminding children that maths is everywhere and that maths is needed every day in all sorts of practical ways. Get your children to help with online purchases, add up bills in cafes or work out the area and perimeter of the back yard. Younger children can play I spy with bus numbers and house numbers. Make a simple game by choosing a number (eg 32) and try seeing how many different ways you can make that number! $(3 \times 10 +$ 2) (2×16) Who will win? Can you make a simple MENTAL maths game for your friends to play during wet play??

Spelling at St George's RC School

We are having a huge emphasis this year on spelling. At the beginning of the year each child was assessed to find out their spelling age using the SPAR spelling test. They will be reassessed during our regular assessment weeks.

Spelling strategies are being used in each class to TEACH children how to spell. Reading really helps with spelling but there are also spelling rules that need to be learned. Each child is taught from reception class how to use a dictionary and by the time the children are in KS2 their dictionary skills should be very good. Why not play some dictionary games at home? See how quickly you can find a word and then read the definition. Is it a noun, a verb or an adjective? Remember to look for the ROOT word. Spellings may be sent home for children to learn and they will be tested in context (using them in sentences and in their work) rather than learning a list of stand-alone words. Pop into school to see your child's teacher to see how you can help even more at home.
