<b>Intent</b>	<p>At St.George's, we want every child to be happy and enthusiastic learners of Art, and to be eager to achieve their very best in order to fulfil their God-given talents. We firmly believe that the recipe for success is high quality teaching in Art. We want our children to be creative and engaged, with the knowledge and skills to experiment, invent and create their own works of art. They should be critical thinkers and develop a deeper understanding of the subject as well as forms that have shaped our history and culture</p>
<b>Implementation</b>	<p>Across the school the children will be exposed to a broad range of different kinds of art. As they progress through each Year , they will develop their techniques and have the opportunity to apply these creatively. Fundamentals such as drawing, sketching, use of shape and colour and imagination are built upon with each new topic, so that pupils feel confident to apply these independently as they move through the school.</p> <p><b><u>Rotation Project Work</u></b> The Art Lead oversees Art lessons and planning for each year group to ensure there is continuity and progression in Art Skills as the children move through the school.</p> <p><b><u>Enrichment</u></b> Children have opportunities to attend an Art Club. They visit the York Art Gallery and learn from Visiting Artists. Their work is regularly exhibited in a local art gallery. There are many Cross curricular opportunities for children to develop Art.</p> <p><b><u>Display</u></b> Best examples of art work, are displayed in each year group and are rotated regularly. Artwork is displayed in an attractive frame, and presented as in an art gallery, to enhance the work and as a celebration of success.</p> <p><b><u>Pupil Work Reflection</u></b> For every piece of art work the child reflects using a 'Pupil Reflection Sheet'. They are taught to think</p>

	<p>critically about art, including their own.</p> <p><b>Assessment and Moderation</b></p> <p>Pupils work is stored in a Sketch Book which is transferred to their new class as they progress through the school. Other Art work is photographed, assessed and stored on the staff network folders. Work is assessed and moderated to ensure consistency in teacher assessment.</p> <p><b><u>Staff CPD</u></b></p> <p>The Art lead organises and delivers CPD for the staff so they are confident about teaching specific art skills for a topic. The staff are also encouraged to attend courses to further their skills.</p>
<p><b>Impact</b></p>	<p>Children are happy learners within Art. They experience a wide ranging number of learning challenges in the art and know appropriate responses to them.</p> <p>Through art children deepen their appreciation of their faith and fulfil their God given talents. Visits within Art have enriched the lives of the children and they are able to discuss how the experience impacted their knowledge and understanding.</p>
