Block people/leave the game or group/mute people, 'AFK' away from keyboard/don't talk to anyone you don't know/report it.

Have you ever been or seen anyone being bullied?

A few agreed they had seen unkind comments on games at home.

How seriously do you feel that school takes the issue of bullying?

Very - we notice that the teachers always take care of it...Yeah they immediately sort it out.
In our well-being afternoons the teachers are always checking that you're alright and that you're feeling ok.

What does school do to help stop bullying?

Friendship (anti bullying) week
 We do about it in rotation like how to be safe online.
 Teachers take children out and talk to them and deal with it to let them know it is not acceptable.
 They might get Mrs Statham if it's very serious.
 We have a school uniform so everyone is the same so no-one can make fun of someone's clothes.
 It's nice because you can talk to a teacher who you are comfortable with and everyone has a few teachers to choose from.
