#### Reminders

Please could we ask that children bring in:

- a pair of black indoor plimsoles to wear inside.
- a drawstring PE bag with a spare change of clothes inside, in case they need them. No backpacks please as we don't have the space for them.
- a named drinks bottle containing water. We will have a snack during the morning of milk / water and a choice of fruit or vegetables provided by school.
- Raincoats with hoods each day.
- shoes that are safe to climb in every day e.g. trainers or school shoes (no Crocs, sandals or wellies). This allows all children to play outside regularly and safely (including on the castle).
- Wellies to be kept at school for wet days.

#### Curriculum

We offer a broad curriculum covering many areas of learning in each session. However, we plan to focus on these specific areas on the following days:

Monday - Writing and creative development

Tuesday - R.E

Wednesday - Reading

Thursday - Number (maths), Fine Motor

Friday - Understanding the world

### Learning

Our focus for this half term is getting to know the children, developing their friendships and settling them into the Nursery classroom. The children are doing really well at beginning to choose their own activities and following the routines. In addition to this, we will be learning about:

Traditional Stories

Ourselves and our names

Our family and their names

Our facial features

Our senses

Reciting, ordering and writing numbers to five Comparing the size of different objects and

learning the correct mathematical language

Patterns around us, both in the natural world and on clothes, etc  $\,$ 

Counting rhymes (e.g., One, two buckle my shoe; One potato, two potato; Once I caught a fish alive)
