Activities to practise at home – here a few ideas of short and simple activities you could do at home to support your child's learning:

- 2. Talk about and name 2D shapes, for example, circles, and rectangles and say how many sides and corner they have.
- 3. The children are doing brilliantly at holding their pencils and scissors correctly. Please continue to practice these skills at home and alter their grip where needed.
